

THIS ENDORSEMENT CHANGES THE POLICY. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY

Additional Coverage -- Extra Expenses Necessary to Return or Remediate Seized or Confiscated Musical Instruments

1. We will pay the necessary and reasonable extra expenses that you must pay to recover, or attempt to recover, your "musical instrument" listed and described on the Schedule of Covered Instruments when such property is seized or confiscated by Customs service agents or other governmental authority during the policy period but coverage only applies only when such seizure or confiscation occurs as a result of your alleged violation of laws, statutes or regulations that regulate the trade of endangered wild animals and/or plants or the materials derived from either of these. Examples of such laws include but are not limited to:
 - a. African Elephant Conservation and Legal Ivory Possession Act of 2015;
 - b. The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora ("CITES");
 - c. The Lacey Act; or
 - d. Any other law constituted after the inception of this Policy which regulates the trade or transportation of endangered wild animals or plants.
2. Extra expenses, as used here, means only those expenses that you incur necessary to prove that your "musical instrument" was not in violation of the law, statute or regulation and which you would not have incurred had the property not been seized or confiscated. Covered expenses are limited to:
 - a. The costs to research or document that the seized property was not subject to seizure or confiscation;
 - b. Legal expenses; or
 - c. Expedited cost to reproduce or ship paperwork necessary to prove that the "musical instrument" was not illegally obtained or in the course of illegal transportation or trade.

Extra expenses does not mean and does not include fines or penalties.

3. It is a condition of this coverage that you must comply with all laws, statutes and regulations which regulate the trade or transportation of wild animals and/or plants or the materials derived from with either of these to the best of your abilities.

This additional coverage shall not apply and shall be null and void if you were aware, at the time of the seizure of your "musical instrument" that such property was contraband and prohibited from transportation or trade.
